


Early Childhood Center and Preschool

Ducky Room

(ages 24 months to 36 months)



Our Ducky Room is the perfect group for all those little ones 24 - 36 months old to explore, discover, and play. Parents will see their little ones gain social skills like sharing, personal confidence in self-help skills and grow in their knowledge of God's love for them.

Lamb Room

(age 36 months through age 4)

Preschool



In the Lamb Room, children who are 3 or 4 years old begin to develop their understanding of reading, math and science concepts through many hands-on experiences as they explore, discover, and play together.

Whale Room

(4 and 5 years)

Prekindergarten



Students who are 4 or 5 years old move into the Whale Room fully expecting to prepare themselves for entry into Kindergarten. Pre-readiness in reading, math, science, and technology skills are developed as they play, explore, and learn with their friends.



Fine Motor Development

Children enhance their fine motor skills when playing with blocks, puzzles, scissors, play dough, clay, and multiple sensory table activities.

- A healthy environment, rest, and physical exercise

What will your child learn?

Spanish

Second language awareness and acquisition begins with the preschool children. Through the use of songs, games, and bilingual storybooks, students begin learning to follow Spanish directions and basic vocabulary that includes:

- numbers
- colors
- foods
- clothing
- parts of the body



Music

Children are presented with wonderful opportunities to explore the process of creating music. Through the use of poems, rhymes, simple songs, movement, and Orff instruments, children explore steady beat, matching pitch, and simple music concepts like loud and soft, high and low. They have many opportunities to make a joyful noise to the Lord.

Kindergarten Connection



Kindergarten Connection is a unique program offered at the pre-kindergarten level that gives students an opportunity to experience Kindergarten.

This program serves to help pre-kindergarten students make a seamless transition from a preschool setting into a Kindergarten setting.

Teachers create a fun experience where students are able to be with current Kindergarten students. This unique program allows children to discover Kindergarten through story time, learning centers & creative expression. The children really enjoy this learning and social play time with their Kindergarten friends.



Another wonderful benefit of this program for Whale Room pre-kindergarteners choosing to enroll at Our Savior is that they will experience a seamless transition into Kindergarten, as this child will already know and love their Kindergarten teacher.

Social & Emotional Development

Activities and discussion times are planned to help children:


- Develop positive self-esteem

What will your child learn?

Language Arts

Our language arts program integrates reading, writing, speaking and listening. Our goals for the children include:



- Read and write the letters of the alphabet
- Develop phonetic awareness skills
- Recognize beginning and ending letter sounds
- Recognize rhyming words
- Segment words to hear each sound
- Blend sounds together to make words
- Learn to appreciate good literature and to love reading
- Have a beginning sight word vocabulary that they can read and write
- Listen, follow directions and express their own ideas through speaking and writing

Spanish

Through the use of songs, games, and bilingual storybooks, students learn to follow Spanish directions and basic vocabulary that includes:

- numbers
- colors
- foods
- clothing
- parts of the body



What will your child learn?

Math

In Math, by the end of Kindergarten, students will:

- Count with understanding
- Sort, compare, and classify objects
- Use a variety of methods to measure objects
- Observe and create patterns
- Understand and compute by adding and subtracting
- Communicate mathematical ideas in a variety of ways
- Make predictions based on information given



Science & Social Studies

In Science, Kindergarten students will:

- Grow in appreciation of God's creations
- Learn how God created us in His image and that we are all wonderfully made
- Learn about the world, their environment, and the people around them, as well as God's wonderful plan for us
- Accept and help people everywhere
- Learn about some of our country's leaders

Art

Art and Critical Thinking activities are offered that help children:

- Express their own ideas with a variety of media
- Learn to appreciate art as gifts from God



Technology

Students meet weekly for technology instruction. Students are taught how to use their Chromebooks:

- Basics of how to use Chromebooks
- Math and Language Arts skill development
- Assessment tour



What will your child learn?

Music

Kindergarten is a fun time to be learning music. Through music, poetry, stories, movement, and rhythm instruments, students begin to explore the elements of music; rhythm, melody, and timbre. The children learn to use their large motor skills to play Orff instruments and dance simple dances. They sing and laugh often while learning to create music.



Physical Education

Fitness is Fun! Students will participate in Physical Education five days a week:

- Students will explore Physical Education through both non-locomotor and locomotor movements and fitness activities
- Gross Motor skills will improve through the use of scooters, jump ropes, balls and the use of the parachute
- Manipulative skills will be practiced using bean-bags, juggling scarves and beach balls

Extended Care (EC) is a before and after-school program offering flexibility and extended hours to fit your student's unique schedule. We offer a safe environment for your child and the convenience of bus service through the Minnetonka district to Excelsior and Minnewashta elementary schools. EC is designed to encourage healthy development by encouraging children to play, make new friends, explore outdoor activities and by providing much needed time for homework or quiet reading.

Non-school Days: EC is available to all students on non-school days. Please contact us to make these arrangements.

Cost:

1st hour: \$5.50

2nd hour: \$5.50 = \$11.00

3rd hour: \$5.50 = \$16.50

4th hour: \$5.50 = \$22.00

5th hour: \$5.50 = \$27.50

More than 5 hours = \$31.50
