## Stay Home When You are Sick

Typical illness exclusions

Please notify the OSS immediately if your child has been diagnosed as having a contagious disease, flu symptoms, a virus, etc. We will notify parents in writing when children have been exposed to communicable diseases.

Please DO NOT send your child if they are <u>ill</u>. If your child becomes ill in our care, we will inform you and expect him/her to be picked up promptly. The length of time an individual should be excluded from a program will vary depending on the illness or disease. Please keep a child home:

- who is experiencing respiratory distress; active cough; thick discharge from nose
- with chicken pox unless lesions are crusted over and the child is no longer contagious
- who has vomited in the last 24 hours
- who has contagious conjunctivitis (pink eye) or pus draining from eye
- who has three or more loose stools in 24 hours
- who has a bacterial infection (like strep or impetigo) and not been on antibiotics for 24 hours
- who has unexplained lethargy
- who has lice, ringworm or scabies that is untreated and contagious
- who has a 100-degree or higher temperature of undiagnosed origin in the last 24 hours
- who is unable to participate in activities without unreasonable discomfort
- with a reportable illness as specified by the Health Department.

## **Room Closures for Cleaning**

At the discretion of the Director, if there are multiple positive cases in a classroom, we have the right to close a room 1-2 days to properly clean and disinfect it.

## **Special Notes**

If a child / staff member is experiencing COVID-19 symptoms or awaiting test results

Stay home until test results have come in

If a member of your household is experiencing COVID-19 symptoms or awaiting test results

• <u>DO NOT enter the building</u>. If you need to pick up a child, call ahead and staff can bring your child(ren) to your vehicle.

## **COVID-19 Symptoms**

If a child / staff member are experiencing one or more COVID-19 symptoms

- Stay home, evaluate and get tested if symptoms are still present after 48 hours (2 negative antigen tests)
  - o Fever
  - Cough
  - o Shortness of breath
  - o Chills
  - o Headache
  - Muscle pain
  - Sore throat

- o Fatigue
- Congestion or runny nose
- Loss of taste or smell
- Nausea
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- If symptoms begin during the day, the child or staff member must go home

### If a Child or Staff Member Tests Positive for COVID-19

Child Isolation (Koala, Ducky, Lamb, Whale, Kindergarten, Extended Care)

If your child tests positive for COVID-19

- The day symptoms began is day zero, or of If asymptomatic, day zero is the day of the test
- Stay home for 5 days (monitor symptoms and isolate from household)
- Test on Days 5 and 7 (48 hours apart)
- If no fever for 24 hours, symptoms improve (child no longer feels ill and is back to their daily routine)
   and there are two negative antigen test results, return on Day 8
  - Masks could be worn though day 10

#### **Staff Member Isolation**

If a staff member tests positive for COVID-19

- The day symptoms began is day zero, or of If asymptomatic, day zero is the day of the test
- Stay home for 5 days (monitor symptoms and isolate from household)
- Test on Days 5 and 7 (48 hours apart)
- If no fever for 24 hours, symptoms improve or are asymptomatic, return on Day 6
- Staff <u>must wear a mask</u> until 2nd test comes back negative
  - Masks could be worn though day 10

## If someone in your household tests positive for COVID-19

#### Early Childhood Students (Infant to Kindergarten) NEED to Quarantine

If someone in your household tests positive for COVID-19, the child <u>must stay home</u> and <u>quarantine</u>.

- Close contact date is day zero
- Stay home for 5 days
- Mask and separate from the infected person as much as possible
- Test at day 5
- With one negative antigen test, return on Day 6
- Monitor for symptoms through day 10
  - o (CDC) Masks are recommended through day 10

#### **Extended Care Students or Staff DO NOT need to Quarantine**

If someone in your household tests positive for COVID-19, EC students or Staff do not need to quarantine.

- Close contact date is day zero
- Mask and separate from the infected person as much as possible
- Masks must be worn through day 5
- Test at day 5
- With one negative antigen test, masks are not required on Day 6
- Monitor for symptoms through day 10
  - o (CDC) Masks are recommended through day 10

## **Quarantine is NOT required for Close Contact Exposure**

Students / staff are <u>not</u> required to quarantine after a close contact

- You have had a close contact in the classroom or community
- The close contact as a beginning and end
  - The close contact cannot be in your home
- Tested on Day 5
- Monitor for symptoms through day 10
  - o (CDC) Masks are recommended through day 10

## **COVID Tuition Refund Policy**

Approved by Board of Directors on 12/15/2020

Adjustment approved by Education Committee with quarantine changes 1/5/2022

+Adjustments approved by the Board of Director 1/19/2022

- Refunds will be issued for school days absent (not counting weekends or holidays)
  - + If a classroom is closed for a <u>full day</u> due to lack of staffing or classroom disinfecting
- Credits against next tuition billing will be issued as soon as possible, depending on the timing of the closure/quarantine and your billing cycle.
- Refunds will <u>not</u> be issued
  - o if you had previously informed the school you would not be present
  - + if you or your student is waiting for test results or sick with COVID-19
  - + if you are quarantined because of a close contact in your home
  - o + if the classroom is open and you are choosing to keep your child home to quarantine
